


THE 100 BEST PROJECTS WITH RECLAIMED MATERIALS





A PASSION FOR ANTIQUE BUILDING MATERIALS SINCE 1965

In the mid-1960s, Lambert van Alebeek founded a company dealing in old building materials: 't Achterhuis. This business has grown to become a respected wholesaler and retail outlet for reclaimed construction materials, partly through the efforts of the next generation of the family. Visitors can view a large number of model interiors in the showrooms of 't Achterhuis and gain inspiration for incorporating these historic building materials within their own living environments. 
The kitchen is in old oak planks. Floors in 16 x 16cm tiles, wall in witjes.
